Our past president, Mr. Billy Roland, has been with the Golden Triangle since the beginning. He states "We went from being the youngest RC&D in Georgia to being the most progressive. We've been named Outstanding Council twice since 2016." He went on to add "I've seen a lot of changes over the years, and we've had some great leaders involved. Golden Triangle has completed a lot of projects and been able to help many cities, counties, and individuals along the way. We've doubled the size of our service delivery area over the years."

To date, Jerome Brown has been the longest serving Coordinator/Director for Golden Triangle. I reached out to Jerome, to see if he would comment on his time with Golden Triangle.
